

## 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time - November 24th, 2019 The Feast of Christ the King

In your prayers please remember those who are ill and those who care for them, in your prayers prease for them, the lonely, the disabled and those who have died especially Shirley Foley, sister of Ann-Marie Fillmore of our Parish.

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK: King from the Cross. The account of David's anointing in today's first reading, speaks of his closeness to the people and his future role as a shepherd-king. In Luke's gospel, the inscription placed on the cross does, in fact, point to the reality, the reign of Jesus. But this descendant of David comes to the throne through the path of rejection and death. The criminal crucified with Christ is assured place in the reign of God as death envelopes both king and suppliant. The reading from Colossians speaks of the lordship of Jesus as embracing not only the church, but all of creation.

Today, Sunday, November 24th in the Catholic calendar is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King, the last Sunday of the Church year. The feast of Christ the King is celebrated in the Roman Catholic Church in honour of Jesus Christ as lord over all creation. The Kingdom of God is the central teaching of Jesus throughout the Gospels. The word kingdom appears more than any other word throughout the four Gospels. Jesus begins His public ministry by preaching the kingdom, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel (Mark 1:14)".

Advent Prayer Booklets - You will find on the tables at the entrance prayer/meditation booklets for Advent which I encourage you to use during this holy season as families and individuals as you prayerfully enter into this special time of preparation for the great feast of Christmas.

A WORD FROM DEACON ADRIEN: In what way does a person exercise his or her proper right to worship God in truth and in freedom? Every person has the right and the moral duty to seek the truth, especially in what concerns God and his Church. Once the truth is known, each person has the right and moral duty to embrace it, to guard it faithfully and to render God authentic worship. At the same time, the dignity of the human person requires that in religious matters no one may be forced to act against conscience nor be restrained, within the just limits of public order, from acting in conformity with conscience, privately or publicly, alone or in association with others. 
