**WHAT IS A SOLEMNITY, FEAST, MEMORIAL, AND A FERIAL:** In the liturgical calendar of the Church, these designations essentially give us the importance what we are celebrating:

A **Solemnity** is the highest liturgical feast. A Gloria and the Creed are always said and there are always two readings, the psalm and the gospel. All Sundays, Feasts of the Lord Jesus, and certain feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary are Solemnities as well as St. Joseph, the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome and Sts. Peter and Paul. The patron Saint of parish church and the day of its consecration and dedication are also solemnities in that church.

*A Feast* has the Gloria and, sometimes a first and second reading, psalm and the gospel. The feast days of the Apostles as well as other saints.

**A Memorial** is the celebration of a certain saint. Some memorials are optional and, therefore, the priest can choose to celebrate it or to use the ferial.

*Ferial* simply means daily. If there is no Solemnity, Feast or Memorial then the daily Mass is celebrated.

<u>MISSA PRO POPULO??</u> Every Sunday there is a Missa Pro Populo either at Holy Name or at the Cathedral. It is literally translated as "Mass for the people". It is an obligation of every parish priest or administrator to celebrate the Mass for the people that he shepherds on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

**CATHEDRAL HOUSE UPDATE:** Due to issues with a necessary permit for the elevator being delayed, the move in date for any retired clergy will be delayed until October. At some point in September, however, the Parish Office will be able to move back into the Cathedral.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN THE BISHOP LEAVES? Archbishop-designate Guy Desrochers will be installed in October as the Archbishop of Moncton, NB. Once he is installed, one of two things will happen: 1) Either the Holy See will announce that a certain bishop will become the Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese (as happened when Archbishop Mulhall was moved) or the College of Consultors, which is a group of priests appointed by Bishop Desrochers, will meet and elect a priest to serve as the Diocesan Administrator of the Diocese until a new bishop is installed. Monsignor Peter Breen, Monsignor Michael Barry and Father Patrick Tait all served in this role in the past. The Diocesan Administrator's role is to keep the day-to-day business of the Diocese running until a new bishop is chosen.

**<u>VOCATIONS TO THE PRIESTHOOD:</u>** We are all aware of Rev. Mr. Lukas Casta who was ordained to the transitional diaconate. He will return to St. Augustine's Seminary in Toronto to finish his final year of formation and then, God willing, be ordained a priest at some point next year. As well, Mr. Marcus Poisson, a parishioner of Ste-Bernadette Parish in Bonfield, Ontario, will be entering his first year of seminary at St. Peter's Seminary in London, Ontario. Please offer up many prayers for these two men as the discern God's call in their lives.

**NOTE FROM FATHER BEACHEY:** I thank you for your patience during a very difficult period of transition. For the past year, you have had to share the Rector with two other parishes and now, one other parish. It has been a year of transition for me as well. We are seeing the light at the end of the tunnel. Soon buildings will be operational as will offices. I will move into my new residence in a week (or two) at the most. I am looking forward to some normality to return. In September, I will be taking a break for a couple of weeks.

<u>THE BEHEADING OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST:</u> Out of jealous, vindictiveness and hatred was this Holy Man of God murdered.
