

ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR THIS WEEK:

MASS OF THANKSGIVING for the Episcopal Ministry of the Most Reverend Guy Desrochers, C.SS.R. as the ninth Bishop of Pembroke will be held at the Cathedral of St. Columbkille, Pembroke, on Wednesday, October 4, 2023 at 2:30 p.m. A farewell reception will be held in the Cathedral Hall immediately after the Mass. All are welcome for this occasion to wish Archbishop-designate Desrochers well as departs to assume his ministry in the Archdiocese of Moncton.

WORDS OF SUPPORT FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR: A belated word of support and encouragement to all our students, teachers and support staff who have returned to classes for a new academic year during the past week at Cathedral Elementary and Bishop Smith High Schools and to all other students at other places of learning...home schooling, college or university. You are in our thoughts and pravers and we wish all of you a year of growth and success in every way.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN THE BISHOP LEAVES? Archbishop-designate Guy Desrochers will be installed in October as the Archbishop of Moncton, NB. Once he is installed, one of two things will happen: 1) Either the Holy See will announce that a certain bishop will become the Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese (as happened when Archbishop Mulhall was moved) or the College of Consultors, which is a group of priests appointed by Bishop Desrochers, will meet and elect a priest to serve as the Diocesan Administrator of the Diocese until a new bishop is installed. Monsignor Peter Breen, Monsignor Michael Barry and Father Patrick Tait all served in this role in the past. The Diocesan Administrator's role is to keep the day-to-day business of the Diocese running until a new bishop is chosen.

NOTE FROM FATHER BEACHEY: I thank you for your patience during a very difficult period of transition. For the past year, you have had to share the Rector with two other parishes and now, one other parish. It has been a year of transition for me as well. We are seeing the light at the end of the tunnel. Soon buildings will be operational as will offices. I will move into my new residence in a week (or two) at the most. I am looking forward to some normality to return. In September, I will be taking a break for a couple of weeks.

THE CATHEDRAL HOUSE (A SHORT HISTORY): This new term for the historic building next to the Cathedral Church is to reflect its new function as a residence for the retired priests of the Diocese even though it will still be used as the Cathedral Rectory and Offices. Construction began in 1885 and completed in 1887. Because the bishop was living there, the house was built large and would have been referred to as "the Bishop's Palace". In the original design of the building, the second floor, at the rear towards Moffat Street was the only suite in the building. There was a sitting room and a bedroom. This was where Bishop Lorrain, Bishop Ryan and Bishop Nelligan (for a time) resided. The third floor originally housed the Christian Brothers until they found their own house. There were additions in later years, but the original part of the house comprises of the three stories with the tower and the kitchen. The kitchen was only one story. If you look at the stones, you will notice a marked difference between the original one-story kitchen and the addition of the convent. The Petites Sœurs de la Sainte Famille (Little sisters of the Holy Family) arrived in 1906. This order of sisters, began by the Blessed Marie-Léonie Paradis, would serve the Cathedral priests and bishops until 1995. One can assume that the convent at the back was added at this time. You will notice the curiosity at the back of the convent, second floor, where part of the Sisters' chapel protrudes out from the rest of the building. This was because the law of the Church at the time forbade any bedroom to be above the Blessed Sacrament. Thus, the protrusion ensured that the law was followed. The next addition was towards Moffat Street and built in the time of Bishop Nelligan – around 1938 – 1940. The first floor was dedicated to the Chancery Office and the second floor became the bishop's office and living area. A large room with hardwood panelling still exists today intact with its beautiful marble fireplace. The basement was used as a recreation room for the priests who lived at the Cathedral with a pool table. After Bishop W. J. Smith moved to the next addition, Monsignor Barry used this suite until his retirement in 2003. It was in 1965 that the old Chancery Office was built. The first floor was used for Diocesan Offices and the second floor provided the bishop with a very large living space. An elevator was installed but used only three times: twice by Bishop W. J. Smith and once by Bishop Windle. On all three occasions the elevator got stuck with the bishop inside and so they never trusted it again. Bishop Richard W. Smith decided to purchase a new bishop's house away from the Chancery Offices in the early 2000s and moved to Maple Ave. That residence was only recently sold, and the bishop's residence is now on Irving Street next to Lourdes. As we are all aware, the Chancery Office built in 1965 was demolished last May. In my own humble opinion, its demolition should not cause any tears as it did not match or add anything to the original structure but detracted but the old Bishop's Palace's beauty.
